INSTRUCTIONS: Please complete the following questionnaire. The purpose of these questions is not to ask unnecessarily about personal matters. It is simply to determine whether a prospective juror can decide the case fairly and impartially. This questionnaire will not be made public.

Please do not discuss the questionnaire or your answers with anyone. It is very important that the answers be yours and yours alone. Remember that there are no "right" or "wrong" answers; only truthful answers. You are sworn to give true and complete answers to all questions.

Please print your answers and use ink to insure legibility. Please write your name and assigned juror number on the first page and your juror number on each page thereafter.

DESCRIPTION OF THE CHARGES: The court briefly summarizes the charges so that you can have a general understanding of what will be at issue in this case.

It is the government that has the burden of proof under our system of laws. The prosecution must come forward with proof "beyond a reasonable doubt" that a defendant has committed crimes charged before a defendant can be found guilty. The defendant has no obligation to produce any evidence or do anything else at trial. This is because "the law presumes a defendant to be innocent" of the charges brought against him.
